MORE STORIES ALONG THE WAY 2008 - 2012

In 2008 we celebrated our Platinum Anniversary at our Annual Open Tournament hosted by the Catalina Country Club. Being able to use the three courses at Catalina enabled us to accommodate fields of 317 on the Wednesday, 305 on Thursday and 142 Pairs for the Foursomes competition on the Friday. Catalina Ladies entertained us magnificently with the theme for the evening showcasing how our Association has evolved over the years. We also hosted the Southern Cup this year and congratulations are extended to Melinda Asbury from Moruya for taking out this event.

2009 saw our Tournament head to the mountains and we thank the Coolamatong Country Club for their generous support and hospitality. Day 1 saw 189 players, Day 2 187 and 73 pairs competed on the Friday. With the Southern Tablelands still suffering from the drought this year, the effort of everyone involved in ensuring the course was presented so well is a great credit to the many volunteers supporting the Club. With a new course layout, a course record of 77 was set by Ros Haenig from Eden during the Tournament. The entertainment provided by the Coolamatong ladies reinforced our belief that they sure know how to party.

Bega played host to our 2010 Tournament. With course capacity being exceeded, Tathra Beach was called upon to assist with Division 2 playing at Tathra on the Wednesday and Division 3 on the Thursday. Just over 200 players entered the Tournament this year and we sincerely thank Bega for their support and hard work in ensuring that, yet again, the Tournament was a great success. A Garden Party was thrown by the Bega Ladies and was enjoyed by all, appreciating the friendly relaxed atmosphere.

The drought that had lasted for years finally broke in 2011 on the eve of our Tournament. That Pambula Merimbula was able to accommodate any play at all is a major credit to them. With 320 entries this year, easily catered for with three courses at Pambula Merimbula, many decisions and agonising moments were addressed by the Match Committee. Play was to go ahead with all bunkers out of play, and even though the course was wet, carts were still allowed to be used. The Pambula Merimbula Golf Club went out of their way to assist in any way they could thus ensuring a successful, if not wet, Tournament. The entertainment provided by the Pambula Merimbula ladies certainly left us with a night to remember. It really is difficult to guess just who is who when you see them dressed like Hollywood stars.

Rain again looked like creating havoc for the 2012 Tournament at Moruya. With course capacity being exceeded, the Catalina Country Club was called upon to host Division 2 on Wednesday and Division 3 on Thursday. While both courses were wet it did not diminish good scoring and proved to be a resounding success. A prized Hole in One by Barbara Kennedy (Moruya) and a new course record of 71 by Olivia Wilson (NSW) each proved to be highlights. The Southern Cup was also held this year with Olivia Wilson winning the coveted Cup. While Olivia's home club is now the NSW Golf Club, Olivia played her junior golf coming up through the ranks at Catalina. It was obvious from the moment we arrived for dinner just how much effort had gone into ensuring a great night was ahead.

PENNANTS

Pennant over the last 10 years has seen very little change indeed. We still operate with 3 area Zones, 2 on the Coast and 1 on the Tablelands. Each of these Zones has the ability to agree on whether the weekly matches should be played on neutral courses or based on a home and away format, with the number of teams entered in a particular division having a great bearing on the format. All semi-finals and finals are played on a “neutral” course and therefore the venue is unknown until the week before. The format for Pennant is reviewed every two years when all Clubs are asked for their input. In 2006 we decided to introduce a new “A” Reserve Scratch Grade. So as not to diminish the strength of the Division 2 Handicap event, Clubs were only allowed to enter teams in this Grade if they had a team entered in the Division 2. It is particularly difficult to set conditions when there is such a diverse range of players, and the need to cater for the whole Association. With the perfect format still eluding us, discussions, trials and changes will continue for a long time to come!

BEGA

The success of the Bega Country Club has continued over the last five years despite our ladies' numbers decreasing, many due to family and work commitments. Being a small club hasn't stopped our progress both socially and financially over the last five years.

Our club champion for 2008, 2009, 2011 was Wendy Hergenhan, Wendy also teamed with Tammy Edmonds in 2012 to win their 5th consecutive Foursomes Championship. Jana Welsford was Club Champion in 2010 and 2012. Our annual Golfer of the Year has been Jacqui Cross in 2008, Rachael Cuzner in 2009, Debbie McGufficke in 2010, Elyse Cuzner in 2011 and Coleen Atherton in 2012.

In 2009 we were extremely sad at the loss of a valuable member in the passing of Pat Conroy. Pat had held various positions on our committee, contributing much to our ladies golf.

In 2010 we hosted the FSC& TGA Tournament with the assistance of neighbouring club Tathra, due to the large field of over 300. Our presentation dinner was a little different, with our clubhouse capacity for large functions being somewhat restrictive, we decided on a garden party for the meal and then held the presentation in the clubhouse. Our members with the help of Lee Cross provided the guests with great entertainment to conclude the night.

In the last 5 years we have entered at least one pennant team each year. Our Division 3 teams in 2011 and 2012 have been successful in winning the Southern Salver and for the first time since 1972 we were ecstatic with our 2012 team also winning the Beb Fraser Trophy.

Our ladies continue to represent Bega at most Open Tournaments and, of course, the FSC&TGA Tournament. We also continue to enjoy our Inter-club matches between Tathra and Eden, along with the usual Charity days such as Walter & Eliza, and Oncology Day. Our quest to attract and assist beginners to the game continues to grow. On Monday, our 10 Hole competition for beginners continues to evolve and we now have a 10 Hole group playing on Wednesdays. In 2012, the success of this group has enabled us to include a 10 Hole players Championship which sees them play 9 holes over two weeks. They also enjoy playing a Summer Cup which coincides with the club's annual 18 Hole Summer Plate.

One of our greatest achievements has been in conquering the computer system and, for the first time, our Annual Tournament in 2012 was completely computerised. With the ever changing adjustments to our national handicapping system our players handicap adjustments have finally settled and our game progresses.

In 2012, along with the Men's committee, we celebrated Bega's 90th Anniversary Week of Golf. This great milestone culminated in a dinner on the Saturday night with friendships and memories renewed.

Our greenkeepers and volunteers have continued to make improvements around the course especially the new bridges on the 1st, 3rd and 8th and the new sponsor signs on the tees are a great improvement. It was also pleasing to have the course re rated during 2011.

Our clubhouse was used extensively during the Bega RSL Clubs' renovation of Club Bega, of which we are affiliated. We have also recently had extensive renovations done in our kitchen making it a great facility for functions and for our Bistro on Friday nights, which is run by golfing volunteers.

Veronica Coman is our President once again for 2013 and our captain is Robyn Kilkelly and, along with them, we continue to encourage both old and new players in the wonderful game of golf.

BERMAGUI

During this period, we have all endured going through course ratings and changes to the handicapping system. Most handicaps, initially, increased but are now beginning to show signs of decreasing and levelling out.

The decision to combine our Ladies Open, Week of Golf and our Men's Open in 2008 has proven to be very successful with the number of entries in each event increasing each year. In 2013, our Open will be held on the 14th & 15th September.

Have you been to Bermagui lately? If so you would have noticed many changes around the course. A hard working group of volunteers from our Men's Golf have concreted 100's of meters of cart paths for the benefit of cart users and walkers alike. Profits from our "Golfers BBQ" which operates each Saturday go towards materials for the pathways and our ladies participate on a rostering system with the men taking turns to operate the BBQ on alternate weekends. We also have a group of ladies who get together once a month and spend a few hours tidying up around garden beds. All clubs depend on volunteers these days and we at Bermagui are no different.

Bermagui has been rated as one of the top 100 public golf courses in NSW. We were privileged to host the 2011 Men's NSW Senior Championships and we look forward to hosting the 2014 NSW Women's Senior Championships.

We have been very pro-active in recruiting new members. With the help of our Golf Professional, Chris Hearne, we held a clinic for beginners which attracted 13 new players to golf. The clinics will be ongoing and our plan is to arrange two or possibly three in 2013.

CATALINA

Over the past five years, Catalina has maintained its profile as a major Club and golfing destination on the South Coast. Its popularity has seen it continue to be nominated for "Excellence in Tourism and Hospitality" awards, the restaurant and clubhouse abuzz with visitors particularly over weekends. The amalgamation in November 2010 with the Batemans Bay Bowling and Recreation Club also has added another dimension to Club Catalina. The year has also been highlighted by being awarded the captaincy of the Ladies State Team. Hayley's successful year playing in various State Junior competitions has been highlighted by being chosen by the JNJC to represent NSW in Thailand in November of 2012. Only 4 juniors were selected. Hayley returns to Thailand in 2013 as the South East Regional Academy of Sports (SERAS) Junior Player of the Year.

Over the past five years, Catalina has featured twice in the running of the FSC&TGA's annual tournament. In 2008, we were host to the 75th anniversary tournament, and in 2012, with Moruya as host club, Catalina was used for the overflow course for B & C grades. At Moruya in 2012, Catalina girls outdid themselves in accepting more trophies than for the previous five years in total. Olivia Wilson won the 36 hole scratch event which included the Southern Cup and Snowy Mountains Cup, as well as creating a course record of 71 round the newly rated Moruya layout. Margaret Dickinson took out the closed 36 Hole nett event. Many other solid individual rounds of golf contributed to Catalina's overall success. Catalina ladies have entered teams in Pennant every year, usually in each division, although success eluded us until 2012 when our Division One team won the flag. (This broke a seven year drought). Although many of us never had the opportunity to play golf with Joyce as she had stopped walking the fairways before most of the current Lady members started playing golf or actually lived at Batemans Bay, we will always remember her contribution to our prized Golf Club. As a foundation member Joyce had many interesting tales to tell of the time spent preparing the course originally and recounting social events held at the then tiny Clubhouse. We have a "Joyce Lassau Shield" which Joyce sponsored and we will continue to present this shield each year in Joyce's memory.

Goodbye to a Lady with a mischievous sense of humour and a very caring nature, who was involved in a number of local organisations over many years.

A champion of a different vintage is our amazing Daphne Ticehurst. She has been a full playing member of Catalina for 32 years. Daphne will be 90 in October 2013 and apart from still playing at least two 18 hole competitions each week at Catalina, has been seen at many other club tournaments in recent times, including Nowra, Braidwood, Mallacoota, Coolamatong & Mollymook. We have several octogenarians amongst our regular fields of golf on a Wednesday, a couple of these ladies still on foot. Don't we all hope we may be doing the same for the next twenty years or so. In the interim, good golfing for the next five years, and remember "there's nothing wrong with the middle".

We have new signage and the whole thing has gone off smoothly apart from a few nearest the pins being placed on the wrong greens. We are also about to embark on an experiment with our soil. This will involve coring 3 fairways and placing large amounts of recycled organic matter, nutrients and trace elements into the holes. Australian Soil Management is managing this and we hope to end up with better quality soils needing less irrigation.

The computer age is well and truly here and we have been using the computer for all aspects of the game. Many find that it can be too impersonal, but, the majority agrees that



ANNUAL TOURNAMENT - CONDITIONS OF PLAY FOR 2013**

1. Open to full playing Amateur Lady members of Golf Clubs affiliated with GA and Clubs recognized by the Bodies governing Women's Golf in overseas countries.

2. Entries must be on the correct nomination form, and must be sent with fees to the Tournament Secretary. **Entry Fees are not transferable** and will not be refunded after the closing date. Post entries may not be accepted. Entry fees for late entries (if any) must be paid at the Tournament prior to play.

3. The **Match Committee** of the FSC & TGA reserves the right to refuse entry and to alter or make variations to the Conditions of Play during the Tournament. The Rules of Golf and the Local Rules of the Host Clubs will be the Rules of Play during the Tournament. **Any protests** must be lodged with the Match Committee on the day the disputed matter occurred. The Match Committee, whose decision will be final, will settle all disputes and provide all rulings.

4. **Stroke Rounds** will be played in three divisions, at the Mollymook Golf Club. Divisions and handicap limits for each division will be determined after close of entries to equalize divisions. **Foursomes** will be played in three divisions – handicap division for each pair shall be based upon the handicap of the **lowest** player.

5. **Foursomes:** Foursomes will be played at the Mollymook Golf Club. If a player's partner is unable to play for any valid reason, they **must** contact the Tournament Secretary Colleen Bennett on 6494 4250 before substituting another player.

6. **Handicaps- Reductions/Increases:**

* A player shall complete the Tournament, in her division, on her commencement handicap regardless of reductions or increases

* Records of score for the two days will be available at the end of day two.

Club Representatives MUST bring a list of exact handicaps for all nominated players to the Tournament Secretary on Tuesday March 19th 2013

7. **Trophy Limit:** 36 Hole, Daily 18 Hole & Foursomes Events – a player may win the Gross or Nett Trophy in any one event – **NOT BOTH**. Scratch events shall take precedence over nett events. A player may not be awarded more than two 36 Hole Events plus 2 daily 18 Hole Events. Exclusions...The Southern Cup, Mrs R D Bridges Shield (Champion of Champions), WGNSW Golden Jubilee Trophy, Foursomes and Team Events.

8. **Closed Events:** To qualify for competition in the Closed FSC & TGA Events, a player must be handicapped at Home Club affiliated with the FSC & TGA.

9. **Veteran Events:** Yeta Thistleton Veterans Event – limited to FSC & TGA members 60 years of age and over. Diamond Jubilee Veterans Event – open to all players 60 years of age and over, who have NOT won a trophy.

10. **Ties:** In the event of a tie -

a) **The Champion of Champion Event** (Mrs. R D Bridges Shield), players shall be declared joint winners.

- b) For ties in the Individual 36 Hole Events and Foursomes (Perpetual Trophy Events), players shall be declared joint winners receiving trophies/vouchers of equal value.
- c) Where there are ties for second or third place in 36 Hole Events, the GA method of count back will be used.
- d) Daily 18 Hole Events and Team Events, ALL ties will be decided on count back using GA method.

11. **Starting Times:** All players are requested to report **to the designated starter at least 30 minutes before hit-off time, and must be at their designated tee ready to play at least 15 minutes before the allotted start time.** Any player failing to be at to the correct tee at the appointed time will lose her place in the field and will be disqualified. Rule 6-3, 33-7 will apply.

12. **Portable and Mobile Phones and Distance Measuring Devices (DMD):** The audible emission and/or unauthorized use (including checking/sending messages) of a mobile phone by a player or her caddie on a golf course is a serious breach of etiquette and is prohibited. Penalty: One warning, then disqualification. However, players or caddies who have a medical or other serious reason to have a mobile phone switched on, must obtain permission from the starter at the tee for the phone to be turned on in mute mode and used in such emergency. A player may obtain information using a device that measures distance only. If a player uses a DMD that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect play (e.g. gradient, wind speed, temperature, etc.) the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.

13. **Motorised Transport:** Is permitted.

14. **Inclement Weather:** If one day is lost to bad weather, the Championship will become a two day event, and the Foursomes will be cancelled. If two days are lost to bad weather, the Championships will become a one day event and the Foursomes will be cancelled. If all three days are lost, the Championships will be abandoned for the year. No section will be rescheduled. If all the Championships are abandoned, the Committee shall retain 20% of the entry fee as a booking fee, and the remainder will be refunded.

15. **Recall:** Should recall be required due to bad weather during play, a siren will be sounded
