There was a good representation from most zone clubs and a few from further afield at our Annual Tournament in August. 

We are very excited to announce the new Rules of Golf are officially in effect as of January 1st!

As you may know, the Rules Modernization Initiative began seven years ago with a goal to make the Rules more consistent, simple and fair, and easier for golfers to understand and apply. We also wanted to reinforce the game's longstanding principles and traditions. This process required untangling the Rules of Golf and looking at each outcome on its own merit. After taking apart the Rules book, it needed to be put back together, resulting in the largest reorganization of the Rules in more than 60 years. The 34 Rules we had previously were condensed down 24.

Once established, a draft of the new Rules was released to the public in March 2017. The USGA, in partnership with The R&A, actively asked for feedback from golfers all over the world, a first in the history of the game. During the feedback period, we heard from more than 22,000 golfers, including you. That feedback was used to fine-tune the Rules, with the new Rules being shared in spring of 2018.

We can only hope that you enjoyed the feedback process as much as we did. No matter how small your comment or suggestion was, please know that it was greatly appreciated and considered as revisions were taking place.
