PENNANT DECISION REGARDING INCLEMENT WEATHER DURING ROUND

FOR FSC&TGA PENNANTS

The following is the procedure for when playing pennants and inclement weather inundates your Course to such an extent that the play of a hole (or green) becomes unplayable during your round.

- If neither of the players are willing to concede the hole or holes remaining then each player MUST mark their ball and await the drainage of the water from the area or as much as possible that will allow the play to resume. This is provided the Course is not declared unplayable at this point.
- 2. Once play has resumed the players will proceed back to the point where they marked their balls and resume play.
- 3. If the Course is unplayable at this point and play cannot be resumed on the day then the match MUST be recommenced from the point at which it was suspended (marked) on a date agreed by both players and prior to the next round of scheduled matches.
- 4. If the players cannot agree on a date then the FSC&TGA Match Committee will stipulate that the match must be completed by the day prior to the next scheduled rounds of pennant (i.e. Thursday for Northern and Southern Zones and Monday for the Tablelands).
- 5. If a side does not play by the agreed or set date then the other side will be awarded the points.
- 6. If both sides do not play by the agreed or set date then both sides will forfeit all points for that week.

The reason for this is that once a match is commenced then the stipulated round must be 18 holes or part thereof which allows a conclusion to be reached. No matches can be agreed to be shortened to a lesser number of holes that form the stipulated round. (Ref. Decision 2/2)
